PETITION FOR REVIEW

**In The Nature Of An Appeal From The Final Plan Of
The 2011 Legislative Reapportionment Commission**

Pursuant to Section 17(d) of Article 2 of the Pennsylvania Constitution and Pennsylvania Rule of Appellate Procedure 3321, the Petitioner, Councilwoman Patty Kim (“Petitioner”), in both her capacity as an elected official and as an individual voter in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, files this Petition for Review, seeking this Court’s review of the December 12, 2011 final reapportionment plan (“Final Plan”) approved by the 2011 Legislative Reapportionment Commission (“Commission”). In support of the Petition, the Petitioner states as follows:

Statement Of Jurisdiction

1. The basis for the jurisdiction of this Court is Section 17(d) of Article 2 of the Pennsylvania Constitution and 42 Pa. C.S. § 725(1), which provides that the Supreme Court shall have exclusive jurisdiction of appeals from final orders of certain

constitutional and judicial agencies, including the Legislative Reapportionment Commission.

2. This appeal is addressed to the Court's appellate jurisdiction and is in the nature of a petition for review, pursuant to Rule of Appellate Procedure 3321.

Identity Of Party Seeking Review

3. Councilwoman Patty Kim is the duly-elected member of the Harrisburg City Council.

4. Councilwoman Kim is a registered voter in Dauphin County, Pennsylvania. She currently resides in the 15th Senatorial District. Under the Final Plan, the City of Harrisburg, in which Councilwoman Kim resides, will move to the 48th Senatorial District.

5. Councilwoman Kim brings this Petition both in her capacity as an elected official and as an individual registered voter who is aggrieved by the Final Plan.

Identity Of Respondent

6. The Respondent is the 2011 Legislative Reapportionment Commission.

7. Pursuant to Section 17(b) of Article 2 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, the Commission is composed of Senator Dominic Pileggi, the majority leader of the Senate; Senator Costa, the minority leader of the Senate; Representative Michael Turzai, the majority leader of the House of Representatives; Representative Frank Dermody, the minority leader of the House of Representatives; and the Honorable Stephen McEwen, the fifth member selected by this Court after the other four

Commission members were unable to agree on a fifth member. Judge McEwen served as Chair of the Commission.

Determination To Be Reviewed

8. The determination for which the Petitioner seeks review is the Final Plan of the Commission that was approved on December 12, 2011.

9. A copy of the Final Plan for the Pennsylvania Senate and the map reflecting the Final Plan for the Pennsylvania Senate are attached as Appendices A and B.

Controlling Constitutional Provision

10. Section 16 of Article 2 of the Constitution states:

The Commonwealth shall be divided into fifty senatorial and two hundred three representative districts, which shall be composed of compact and contiguous territory as nearly equal in population as practicable. Each senatorial district shall elect one Senator, and each representative district one Representative. **Unless absolutely necessary no county, city, incorporated town, borough, township or ward shall be divided in forming either a senatorial or representative district.**

Pa. Const. Art. 2, sect. 16 (emphasis supplied).

Relevant Procedural Background

11. Pursuant to Section 17(a) of Article 2 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, in 2011, the year following the Federal decennial census (the "Census"), the 2011 Legislative Reapportionment Commission was constituted for the purpose of reapportioning the Commonwealth.

12. Pursuant to Article 17(c) of Article 2 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, the Commission approved a preliminary reapportionment plan on October 31, 2011, by a

3 to 2 vote, with Commission Members Costa and Dermody dissenting. (“Preliminary Plan”).

13. According to comments made on the record by Commission Member Costa, the Preliminary Plan was not revealed to the Senate and House minority leader members of the Commission until one half-hour in advance of the time scheduled for voting on the Preliminary Plan and no meaningful opportunity for review of the Preliminary Plan was provided.

14. The Commission conducted public hearings on the Preliminary Plan on November 18 and November 23, 2011, and allowed for the submission of written comments and concerns.

15. During the course of the hearings, witnesses from across the Commonwealth testified as to the importance of not dividing political subdivisions unnecessarily. Government officials described the difficulties inherent in seeking grants or support for projects where district boundaries divide municipalities and counties. Those whose political subdivisions remained intact generally supported the Preliminary Plan for the very reason that their communities remained intact. However, those whose political subdivisions were split objected to the Preliminary Plan and asked the Commission to make appropriate adjustment to eliminate divisions where possible.

16. The 15th Senatorial District under the Preliminary Plan was an abomination, described in the press as the “Harrisburg Horseshoe”.

17. Councilwoman Kim testified at the public hearing conducted on November 18, 2011. Councilwoman Kim asked the Commission to keep the 15th

Senatorial District intact with the City of Harrisburg included, as it has been for decades, and not chop Dauphin County into an excessive number of Senate Districts.

18. The Commission failed to adequately address Councilwoman Kim's testimony in the formulation and adoption of the Final Plan, and Councilwoman Kim's testimony is reflected in the challenges set forth in this Petition.

19. Although the Commission dramatically rearranged the 15th Senatorial District before the Final Plan, the Commission did so in a manner that only reallocated the Dauphin County residents in the district, not in a manner that either consolidated Harrisburg with the rest of Dauphin County nor in a manner that reduced the splintering of Dauphin County.

20. On November 30, 2011, Senator Costa submitted Exceptions to the Commission's Preliminary Plan. Senator Costa's exceptions also contained a challenge to the exclusion of the City of Harrisburg from the 15th Senatorial District.

21. Before the Commission voted on the Final Plan, Senator Costa presented the Commission with an alternative plan which provided the Commission with an opportunity to respond to the concerns raised by the voters of the Commonwealth. ("Alternative Plan").

22. The Alternative Plan demonstrated that it was not absolutely necessary to separate the City of Harrisburg from the remainder of Dauphin County, and that the Commission's decision to do so reflected electoral performance or other goals not mandated by the Pennsylvania Constitution, instead of the Constitutional requirement of an absolute necessity.

23. The Alternative Plan reflected how numerous political subdivisions could remain intact, even while preserving the general electoral performance characteristics of the districts created with the Preliminary Plan.

24. On December 12, 2011, however the Commission approved the Final Plan by a 4 to 1 vote, without publicly addressing the public comments, including the comments made by Councilwoman Kim, or expressing whether the various splits of political subdivisions were “absolutely necessary.”

25. Senator Costa’s Alternative Plan, along with the statistical information concerning unnecessary splits of political subdivisions, established that the extent of political subdivision splits contained in the Final Plan, was not absolutely necessary.

26. The Final Plan stretches the 15th Senatorial District across four counties, dragging pieces of Adams and Lancaster County into what has traditionally been a Dauphin County district, while removing large swaths of Dauphin County, including the City of Harrisburg.

27. The Final Plan takes pieces of Dauphin County and adds them to districts that stretch from Adams County to Luzerne County. With such scope, the likelihood that Dauphin County is a focus of any Senator will be diminished.

Factual Issues Relevant to Appeal

28. The City of Harrisburg has for many years anchored a Dauphin County-based 15th Senatorial District.

29. Under the Senatorial District map adopted in 1991, the 15th Senatorial District’s boundaries were the boundaries of Dauphin County.

30. In 2001, the 15th Senatorial District was modified such that it remained a district based in Dauphin County around Harrisburg, but a portion of the district was extended into York County and small portions of Dauphin County were moved to other districts..

31. The Pennsylvania Constitution provides that, unless “absolutely necessary,” no county or municipality is to be divided when forming either a senatorial or representative district.

32. The Preliminary Plan altered the 15th Senatorial District which consisted of most of Dauphin County, including the City of Harrisburg, the state capital and county seat of Dauphin County. The Preliminary Plan contained a bizarre C-shaped district that covered five counties and wrapped around Western Westmoreland County and the City of Harrisburg, while the bulk of Dauphin County remained in the 15th Senatorial District.

33. Pursuant to the 2010 Census, Dauphin County has a population of approximately 268,100 people and the population of the Commonwealth is 12,702,379 people.

34. An “ideal” Senatorial District for population equalization is thus 254,048 people.

35. Dauphin County has a sufficient population for one entire Senatorial District with a small portion of its population being located in a second Senatorial District.

36. Any further division of Dauphin County is unnecessary.

37. Although the Final Plan reflected some compacting of the 15th Senatorial District, it continued to exclude the City of Harrisburg, a predominantly minority community, from Dauphin County and from the 15th Senatorial District.

38. The Final Plan split Dauphin County into three Senatorial Districts, the 15th, 27th and 48th. The 15th District includes fragments of Adams, Dauphin, Lancaster and York Counties. The 27th District includes pieces of Dauphin, Luzerne and Snyder Counties together with all of Columbia, Montour and Northumberland Counties. The 48th District includes all of Lebanon, and pieces of Dauphin and Perry Counties.

39. The Commission did not offer any explanation as to why the excess division of Dauphin County was absolutely necessary. The fragmentation of Dauphin County and the separation of the Dauphin County seat from the 15th District, the district that has the largest concentration of Dauphin County residents, was not absolutely necessary.

Objections To The Final Reapportionment Plan

40. The Final Plan is contrary to law because it fails to conform to the requirement of the Pennsylvania Constitution that, unless absolutely necessary, no county or municipality shall be divided in the creation of a senatorial or representative district.

41. The Constitutional requirement that political subdivisions not be subject to division unless “absolutely necessary” is mandatory.

42. At no time did the Commission develop versions of a redistricting plan that attempted to justify the splits of political subdivisions, including Dauphin County, in the Final Plan or to demonstrate that no splits could be eliminated.

43. The Final Plan contains multiple divisions among counties and municipalities that are not absolutely necessary.

44. The Final Plan divides Dauphin County into three districts, rather than the two districts that are minimally required, nor is there a single district that solely represents Dauphin County.

45. At no time did the Commission demonstrate that the divisions contained in the Final Plan are absolutely necessary.

46. The Commission failed to demonstrate that the fracturing of Dauphin County and the exclusion of the City of Harrisburg from the 15th Senatorial District under the Final Plan was absolutely necessary.

47. The Commission failed to address, consider or adjust the Final Plan in accordance with the requests of the public and the evidence of needed revision, and generally failed to undertake the types of considerations mandated by the Pennsylvania Constitution concerning splits of political subdivisions. As reflected in the Alternative Plan, such considerations were readily achievable. Thus, numerous divisions among counties and municipalities contained in the Final Plan are not absolutely necessary and could have been eliminated.


48. Division of Dauphin County into three districts, no one of which is entirely of Dauphin County will materially dilute the representation of the people of Dauphin County.

Relief Requested

49. For the foregoing reasons, the Petitioner asks this Court to determine that the Final Plan is contrary to law under Section 17(d) of Article 2 of the Pennsylvania Constitution and to remand this matter to the Commission with direction to make the following revision to the Final Plan:

- a) Inclusion of the City of Harrisburg in the same Senatorial District as the substantial majority of the people of Dauphin County;
- b) Divide Dauphin County into no more than two Senatorial Districts, one of which shall be entirely contained within Dauphin County;
- c) Make modifications to incorporate the adjustments set forth in the Alternative Plan or to eliminate at least as many unnecessary splits of political subdivisions as set forth in the Alternative Plan, while meeting the other mandated constitutional requirements; and
- d) Prepare any other revisions of the Final Plan that are required to conform to the Constitution.
